The Changing Role of AT Teams - Online

About the Class: In this asynchronous online class, we will challenge you to move forward and address the changing role of your AT team. Course activities including webinars, video recordings, and online discussion forums will give you an opportunity to analyze your current service model to build agency-wide capacity. We will focus on improving service delivery in a time of varying service models including virtual, blended and in person education settings. We will discuss ways to build agency capacity for improved AT services and use online tools to increase efficiency collect data, plan effective outreach. Course discussions will provide time to share thoughts and ideas. You will identify areas of need for your team, rethink the vision for your AT services, and create a multifaceted 3-year plan.

<u>Who Should Attend?</u> AT team members are encouraged, but not required to attend together. Whether you are an individual AT practitioner or part of a local school-based AT team, you will leave with a clear, detailed plan to move into the next decade of AT services. If you are part of a team that provides AT services in public schools, then this course is right for you. Participants include any person who is a member of their agency's AT team including, SLPs, OTs, teachers, school, IT staff, administrators, and any others member.

Outcomes

Participants will:

- develop and articulate a vision for their teams' AT services
- create a 3-year plan for improving AT services
- create a plan for virtual AT services and service adjustments in response to the pandemic.
- identify new ways to build the capacity of the educators to independently provide AT services.
- identify ways to increase access to information about AT and restructure professional development
